The provisions of this Directive particularise and complent Directive 95/46/EC for the purposes mentioned in paraph 1. Moreover, they provide for protection of the legitimate erests of subscribers who are legal persons.

This Directive shall not apply to activities which fall tside the scope of the Treaty establishing the European mmunity, such as those covered by Titles V and VI of the eaty on European Union, and in any case to activities icerning public security, defence, State security (including economic well-being of the State when the activities relate State security matters) and the activities of the State in areas criminal law.

Article 2

Definitions

re as otherwise provided, the definitions in Directive 95/46/ and in Directive 2002/21/EC of the European Parliament 1 of the Council of 7 March 2002 on a common regulatory mework for electronic communications networks and vices (Framework Directive) (¹) shall apply.

e following definitions shall also apply:

'user' means any natural person using a publicly available

can be stored in the network or in the recipient's terminequipment until it is collected by the recipient.

Article 3

Services concerned

1. This Directive shall apply to the processing of perso data in connection with the provision of publicly available el tronic communications services in public communication networks in the Community.

2. Articles 8, 10 and 11 shall apply to subscriber lin connected to digital exchanges and, where technically possi and if it does not require a disproportionate economic effort, subscriber lines connected to analogue exchanges.

3. Cases where it would be technically impossible or requ a disproportionate economic effort to fulfil the requirements Articles 8, 10 and 11 shall be notified to the Commission the Member States.
